The men were believed to be armed and considered dangerous. They were identified as Charles R. Stansburn, 18, Wichita Falls, Texas, charged with first degree rape; Bruce Hammon, 22, Healdton, charged with second degree burglary; and Melvin Kiddize, 31, Turley, accused of passing a bogus check.

They were first spotted by Ott Crossland, who resides six miles southeast of Grandfield. He notified Knox Polk, Grandfield deputy sheriff, who in turn relayed the message to county and Highway Patrol authorities.

Twelve cruisers were dispatched to the south Tillman County area, and Texas state troopers were called in to block all bridges leading across Red River.

The first report received had the escapees in a turquoise 1955 Chevrolet. The car matched the description of one stolen early Thursday from a Lawton car lot.

A .38 caliber automatic pistol was reported stolen Thursday by Lee Dean of Chattanooga. Officers believe it was stolen by the escapees.

Crossland, who was the first to spot the convicts, worked with escapes Hammon while the ex-convict lived in the area. Hammon has relatives living in Grandfield and in Loveland.

The two men entered the bank at 11:30 a.m. and ordered four women employes and two customers to line up against a wall. They ordered them into a vault.

The father of one of the women, Buford Owen, suspected a robbery was in progress and came into the bank. He also was forced into the vault.

A. H. Webb, assistant fire chief released the imprisoned persons about 15 minutes after the robbery.

An employe estimated the robbers took \$20,000 in the hold-up.

Webb said a fire broke out at a Boy Scout hut about three block from the bank about the same time the robbers were fleeing and he theorized that it might have been set to cover their getaway. The bandits were believed traveling in a 1950 Buick.
