New classes to note:

Public Health Law: The Public Health Law course adopts an interdisciplinary perspective to leverage legal tools to enhance public health. It recognizes public health law as a collaborative process involving advocates, attorneys, scientists, public health practitioners, and other stakeholders working together to develop, promote, implement, and assess evidence-based legal reforms and interventions that aim to prevent diseases and reduce injuries. This approach underscores the importance of interdisciplinary collaborations at every stage of the legal change process, from policy research to the evaluation of the effectiveness of legal interventions. Furthermore, the course embraces a Health Justice framework, highlighting the role of attorneys and policymakers in supporting marginalized communities to address inequities through law and policy.

Negotiations: Negotiation is the most commonly used form of legal dispute resolution in the United States and around the world. This course is designed to introduce students to the basics of negotiation through reading, discussion, and simulation exercises. The course focuses on negotiation skills, negotiation theory, lawyer (agent)/client (principal) dynamics, negotiating in teams, negotiation ethics, and multiparty negotiation issues. **Negotiations CANNOT be taken by a student who has taken or is planning to take Interviewing,
